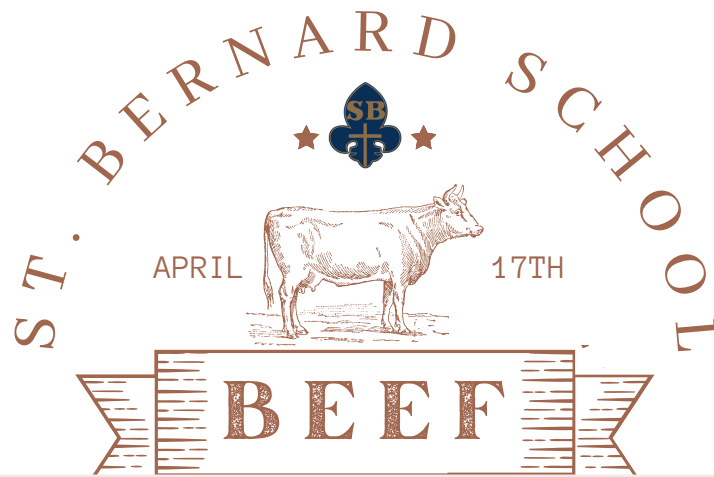

For Wednesday, April 15th and Thursday, April 16th Practice: You will be taught and then practice the tryout cheer and dance as well as give more guidance on the other aspects of the tryouts such as the Spiriting, Jumps, etc. You must attend these practices – they are mandatory in order to tryout. All participants will need to wear comfortable clothing, socks and tennis shoes, and hair MUST be up in a ponytail. Girls are to bring their own water bottles for practice. NO PARENTS, GUESTS, etc. WILL BE ALLOWED TO WATCH THIS PRACTICE.

For Friday, April 17th Tryout: All Candidates MUST Wear Appropriate Athletic Clothing and Footwear (T-Shirts, Shorts, Sneakers, etc.) The shirt and shorts must both be BLACK. Hair MUST be secured in a Ponytail and Out of Your Eyes. More specific tryout information will be sent directly to each participant once the date gets closer.

NOTE: There will be no other tryout dates scheduled.

Please Note: All students who earn a spot on the 2026 – 2027 Cheerleading Squad are REQUIRED to attend cheer camp this summer with us as a squad from June 18 – 20, 2026 at LSU in Baton Rouge.

Also Note: Cheerleading has an annual cost of about \$850 - \$1000.

(The exact cost has not been determined yet, but will be known by the parent meeting held after tryouts).

NOTE: Selecting a cheer squad is a very difficult decision and reality is...not every girl will make the squad. Make sure to come to practice on the 15th and 16th ready to learn the cheer and dance. The purpose of these practice sessions is to teach them to you, but also to see how fast you can learn, retain, and execute choreography, your work ethic and attitude, and to give you pointers. A fast turnaround encourages “muscle memory” rather than overthinking. No videos will be emailed home. Also, this year, we are inviting our 4th graders to try out for the squad.

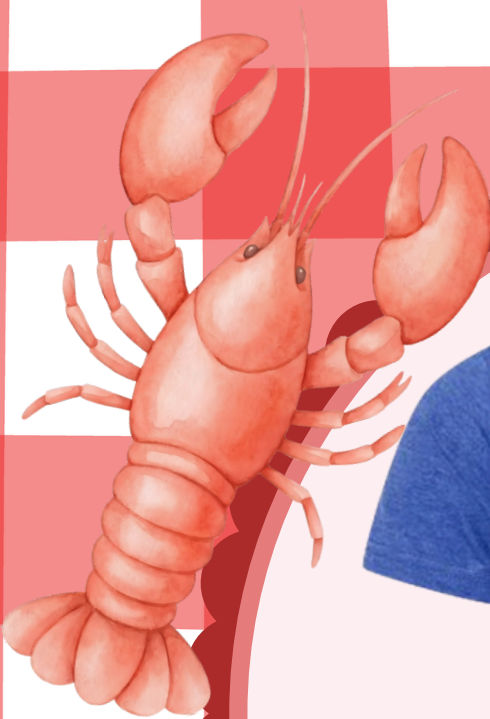

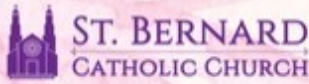
